

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


Pillars and Priority Areas





Priority Area 10 is part of Pillar 4 "Strengthening the Region"




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Cooperation and Capacity-building are the keys to better Living Conditions in the Danube Region

PA10 approach to Local Actors involvement:

- Principles of **subsidiarity**, **transparency** and **participation**
- Policies should take place *where people live*
- Measures should be tailor-made (place-based approach)
- Multi-level Governance



Civil Society involvement is important

- Expertise for policy- & project-development
- Transparency, participation, legitimacy
- Strengthening democratic structures
- Institutional memory & capacity/governance
- Establishing a "macro-regional public sphere"



D-LAP: Danube Local Actors Platform

- Framework for exchange and cooperation between Local Actors of the Danube Region
- Provides an interface for structured consultations between Local Actors, European, national and regional institutions
- Local Actors are: local and regional authorities, social partners, academia, NGO's and policy- and project-promoters
- > Founded 2014, more than hundred participants from all 14 EUSDR member countries



Targets of the D-LAP

- Organize the information flow throughout the Danube Strategy
- Encourage the development of participative governance and place based strategies at the local, regional, national and macro-regional level
- Identify issues where particular attention to civil society development and involvement in the Danube Region is needed
- Identify synergies and build on best practices of existing projects
- Promote new projects and initiatives that could be mutually developed by the existing CSOs in the Danube Region
- Further the development and implementation of funding adapted to the needs of Civil Society and Local Actors

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D-LAP sets "Participation" of Civil Society and Local Actors on the Agenda of the Danube Strategy

Encourage countries to held "National Participation Days"

>Organize the "Danube Participation Day" (in parallel to the Annual Forum of the EUSDR)

>Encouraged the founding of "Danube Civil Society Forum"

>Organize specific thematic stakeholder meetings "Participation Partnership Meetings"
